Fun Facts

The Hubbard Center for Children, on-target to open in September 2021, brings with it a whole host of new and exciting features.

Check out our list of 20 fun facts below.



- The kitchen is almost **4X** bigger than the current kitchen at Children's, and the **8,000** square foot dining area is twice the size of the current space.
- There are 1,650 doors, 9,000 light fixtures, and approximately 20,000 gallons of paint in the Hubbard Center.



- The new imaging suite includes 3 ultrasound rooms, 2 MRIs, 1 CT, 1 procedure room, and 4 X-rays. Lights mirror what the sky looked like on the original hospital's completion date.
- The new emergency department will have 20 exam rooms,
 1 procedure/resuscitation room, and 2 trauma/
 resuscitation rooms
- The trauma elevator is the highest capacity elevator in Omaha at 16,000 pounds.



- There will be 7 new state-of-the-art operating rooms, including 1 operating room dedicated to cardiac cases, 1 for trauma, and 1 operating room next to an MRI control room.
- There will be **32** rooms in the cardiac care unit (CCU), and a rehab room that will include a treadmill, stationary bike, and weights.
- There were more than 100 suppliers and contractors on the project.



Patients and their families will be able to enjoy the outdoor solarium and outdoor viewing garden, which has more than **27,000** square feet of space.

- For hematology and oncology patients, there will be **20** rooms dedicated to their care with **8** of those available to treat bone marrow transplant patients.
- The Fetal Care Center will offer 2 operating rooms,
 2 labor and delivery rooms, 1 stabilization room,
 2 outpatient nesting rooms, and 1 outpatient echo room.
- There are over 280 glass fins on the Hubbard tower with dichroic film that changes colors throughout the day, depending on how the sun hits them.



- A nutrition center will sit in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) that is twice the size of the current formula lab.
- There will be 48 beds total in NICU 6 and NICU 7 that will have refrigerated drawers for breastmilk and formula storage.
- Each patient floor has a dedicated shape and color scheme for easier identification.



- Each inpatient room will have an entertainment system where families can pull up live-language interpreters, including sign language interpreters.
- Families will be able to log in to their own streaming services, and pre-loaded education will be on each TV along with information about discharges.
- The winding curves in the flooring are in reference to the ribbons throughout the corridors of the existing facility.



There will be 32 pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) rooms.

There will also be a room available with equipment to care for minor burn patients.
